SASH

In this issue of the RHA Update you'll find an announcement of the appointment of Robert Baxter to the position of SASH Coordinator for our Templewood Court and Sheldon Towers panel. Rent Payments

Please be reminded that rent is due on the first of each month with a five-day grace period before a \$25.00 late administrative fee is charged to your account. Rents not received by the 20th of the month will result in a Termination of Tenancy and a \$50.00 administrative processing fee. Just a reminder that we are not able to accept cash for rent but will require a check or a money order. Another option for you to consider is automatic monthly payments from your account that you authorize your bank to make on your behalf. Community Input Session

2024 Resident Scholarship Program Now Accepting Applications

HAI Group, our property and liability insurer, is now accepting applications for their 2025 Resident Scholarship Program. This program helps lowincome students pay for higher education. To date more than 1.8 million dollars has been awarded to nearly 500 students, who have gone on to careers in Nursing, Education, Social Work, and more, across the country. This year, they will be awarding scholarships worth \$6,000 each to 20 residents to continue their education. Students may enter and be awarded scholarships for up to four consecutive years. A few things to be mindful of when taking on beautification efforts:

- Mulch cannot be within 18 inches around combustible exteriors of buildings such as wood or vinyl per the Fire Safety Code 527 CMR17
- 2. New gardens or flower beds cannot be installed without prior approval from the Rutland Housing Authority
- If planting areas are not clearly defined, our maintenance team may mistake the plants for weeds and mow them down.
- 4. Garden areas are for all to enjoy, please don't post signs to keep others from using the area.
- 5. Decorations cannot impede the ability of people to pass by easily on walkways. A person using an assistive device needs to be able to safely pass. Additionally, the grassy area must be easily accessible to our mowers.
- The RHA does not provide storage areas for excess garden supplies or tools.
- 7. Storage containers cannot be erected on RHA property.
- 8. Patios and walkways cannot be installed.
- 9. Decorations cannot be political in nature or offensive to any group of people based on national origin, race, sex, orientation, religion.
- 10. Sprinklers, drip systems, etc. cannot be used.
- 11.Do not discard unbagged leaves/garden waste in dumpsters.


Here is easy recipe for any occasion...

Community Health Tip: Sign up now for Farmacy 2025

Farmacy 2025 - the "Food is Medicine" program supported by Community Health - is enrolling participants for the free food deliveries beginning in July.

Community Health patients who are signed up by their healthcare provider for the program will receive 15 weeks of fresh, local vegetables and fruits from Rutland area farms with tips and recipes. Vermont Farmers Food Center (VFFC) will be partnering with 12 farms and coordinating pickups at 8 sites located throughout Rutland County.

If you are interested in receiving a free Farmacy share, talk to your healthcare provider before June 1st while enrollment is open. Participating clinics and providers have to enroll their patients into the program. Talk to your provider today!

Health Tip:
